



A Place for Jazz will swing into spring with a concert on May 16 featuring the remarkable and enduring alto saxophonist Lou Donaldson. He has brought his blues-based style to countless recordings over the years, and we are pleased to kick off this year with his group.

After being drafted into the US Navy in 1945, he played in the Great Lakes Navy Band. After going into Chicago several times, he heard of Charlie Parker and, after

checking him out, decided that this was the style of playing he would make his own. He moved to New York in 1950.

He began his career as a bandleader with Blue Note Records in 1952. He made a series of classic records for Blue Note in the '50s, and takes pride in having showcased many musicians who made their first records as sidemen for him: Horace Silver, Clifford Brown, Grant Green, Blue Mitchell, Donald Byrd, Horace Parlan, and others.

He was awarded an honorary Doctorate of Letters by NC A & T University and a scholarship was established in his name that is awarded to the most gifted jazz musician at NC A & T University each year. He was inducted into the International Jazz Hall of Fame and is the recipient of countless other honors and awards for his outstanding contributions to America's "classical music."

Today, he continues to play at his very best, entertaining audiences worldwide with spirited performances that are always soulful, thoroughly swinging, and steeped in the blues. His hits on Blue Note Records are still high demand favorites and, today, he is the label's oldest musician from that notable era of jazz.

Donaldson will be joined by the brilliant organist Akiko Tsuruga, along with Randy Johnston on guitar and Fukushi Tainaka on drums.

A JAZZ HERO FOR 2014

The Jazz Journalists Association will present longtime APFJ member and former vice president Tom Pierce its 2014 Jazz Hero award. Tom was unanimously nominated by the APFJ board, and will receive the award at the Schenectady Musical Union's Jazz Appreciation Month Gala on April 27 in Robb Alley at Proctors in Schenectady.

Tom has been an active supporter of the Capital Region jazz community in many ways.



He has written CD and concert reviews and articles for a number of Jazz websites, including http://groups.yahoo.com/group/songbirds, allaboutjazz.com, and albanyjazz.com. He has delivered several well-received DVD jazz presentations at a variety of community and commercial venues in Albany, Guilderland, Saratoga and Schenectady.

Tom has been guest host on Albany Jazz Hero Bill McCann's "Saturday Morning Edition of Jazz" show on WCDB Albany. To further provide information on his activities and music preferences in one place, he also designed and maintained since 2007, the website vocaltraditions.com.

In addition to these activities sharing jazz with the public, he provided direct assistance to a number of Jazz vocalists and instrumentalists creating CDs in both New York City and the Capital Region. This has included financing, coordinating copyright requirements, publicizing, promoting and in the case of Colleen Pratt, serving as executive producer of her 2007 release "I Thought About You."

Perhaps his work that has most significantly contributed to the local jazz community has been his support of the A Place for Jazz society from 2001 to the present. He began, at the request of founder Butch Conn, who he met in 2001 on his very first day in the area, by writing reviews and articles for their quarterly newsletter; and also serving on their Advisory Committee, choosing artists for their annual concerts.

Tom's diverse contributions to APFJ have also included grant work, organizational budgeting and planning, publicity, communication and a constant search for ways to continue growth and improvement.

NEW FACES AT SKIDMORE

The Summer Jazz Institute at Skidmore College in Saratoga Springshas been a highlight of the region for some 27 years, bringing in top musicians to work with young players for two weeks every year.

This year, there will be two faculty staffs, one for each of the two weeks of the institute. Bassist and institute director Todd Coolman says there are several reasons for the change.

"We want great players on the faculty but it's just as important that they be great teachers as well," he said. "By having two separate faculties, the students get to learn two different approaches, get to hear two different kinds of advice."

And, of course, during the faculty concerts, the students (and the public) get to hear two different groups of outstanding performers.

The faculty members this year will include Mike Rodriguez, trumpet; James Burton III, trombone; Michael Dease, trombone; Jimmy Greene, tenor sax; Antonio Hart, alto sax; Paul Bollenbeck; guitar; Adam Moezinia, guitar; George Muscatello, guitar; Bill Cunliffe, piano: Doug Weiss, bass: David Wong, bass; Dennis Mackrel, drums; Bob Halek, drums.

Holland's career spans Miles Davis' groundbreaking recordings "In a Silent Way" and "Bitches Brew" and flamenco and bluegrass. He has performed and recorded with Chick Corea, Herbie Hancock and Kenny Barron.

He recently celebrated 40 years as a leader with the formation of Prism, and electric band featuring

Nicki Denner has been a part of the New York Latin and jazz music scene since 1999. Prior, she was an active member of the Minneapolis music community. She has performed with Sheila E., Savion Glover, Candido, Doc Severinsen, as well other jazz and salsa artists in the United States and Europe. Ms. Denner has performed at the Apollo Theater, the Kennedy Center, been a pianist for Lincoln Center's "Meet the Artist" program, Chicago City Limits and "Broadway Underground." As the Musical Director of Cocomama, she lead a nine piece all-female salsa band that has performed at the United Nations, the Metopolitan Museum of Art, the Brooklyn Academy of Music and Central Park.

Since 2001, she has led her own trio. In 2006, the trio released their debut recording, "Moliendo Café", which was named one of the "Top Ten Picks of 2006" in Latin Beat Magazine. Ms. Denner has released two other Latin jazz CD's as a leader, "Don't Just Stand There" and "El Médico de Coquí" which spent six months in Latin Beat magazine's Top 20 Hit Parade.

She is a devoted educator as well as having a private teaching studio. Miss Denner has served on the piano

guitarist Kevin Eubanks, keyboard player Craig Taborn and drummer Eric Harland. He also leads a big band, which has two Grammy awards for its recordings "What Goes Around" and "Overtime."

Holland serves as artist in residence at the Royal Academy of Music and the University of Miami.

The Empire Jazz Orchestra is directed by Dr. William Meckley, head of the music department at SCCC. The April 8 concert will also include music by Miles Davis, Jim Corigliano, Gordon Goodwin, Oliver Nelson and Jimmie Lunceford.
